ForoLAC introduces new Comité Directivo

This month, the [ForoLAC](#) introduced its [new governing body or Comité Directivo](#), consisting of representatives of government, civil society, and the research community. Earlier this year, the forum's Chair, Nora Quesada, issued an open call for nominations and reached out to supply champions from across the region. The committee will look to ForoLAC's [2020-2025 Strategic Plan](#) as its road map and, given the challenges of COVID-19, address the need for robust supply chains. The new team will serve until December 2022.

Country engagement in the VAN grows


Ethiopia leverages VAN membership for end-to-end visibility

New study addresses access to menstrual health products

This month, [Mann Global Health](#) began mapping the complex ecosystem that links access to different menstrual health (MnH) products with market and supply chain considerations – all with the aim of tailoring market interventions to realities on the ground. The work will be completed this summer and will identify bottlenecks and recommend improvements.



Two Peruvian midwives take social media by storm

Two young midwives from the RIAMA network in Peru are using social media to talk about contraception and sexual health. The midwives, [Salma Elguera](#) and [Sandra Barahona](#), together reach nearly a million TikTok followers, plus thousands more on Facebook and Instagram, and tell their story on our Medium platform. No subject is too sensitive as the two regularly cut through embarrassment and stigma to take vital information straight to young women with the help of dance and music. Both midwives obtain their contraceptives from the RHSC-sponsored RIAMA Network in Lima, managed by Peruvian social marketing organization APROPO.

Fireside chat reflects on recent forecasting competition

This month, the Chair of the SSWG, Laila Akhlaghi, moderated a [“Fireside Chat”](#) on the lessons of USAID’s recent Intelligent Forecasting Competition. Evolving health systems and digital infrastructure have made it possible to more accurately predict future contraceptive needs, and the competition sought to encourage innovation in forecasting methods to predict contraceptive consumption, specifically in Côte d'Ivoire’s public sector health system. The discussion included Kevin Pilz and Glenn Milano of USAID; as well as competition winners Trista Chen and Jonathan Soeseno of Inventec.
