## Supply chain management video a hit with young viewers

Some 3,600 viewers, aged 18-34, have tuned in to the first episode of the new LAPTOP video series on careers in supply chain management. More than half the viewers were from Kenya, Tanzania, Ghana, Nigeria, and Uganda. This first instalment of a four-part series explains how supply chains underpin every aspect of life, and how the need for skilled supply chain managers continues to grow. The series,

supported by the David and Lucile Packard Foundation, shares the collective experience of 18 logistics experts who answer challenging questions on educational requirements, gender in the workplace, and suitability for the profession.

### **ISO acts on calls to define standards for menstrual products**

This month, the [International Standards Organization \(ISO\)](#) voted to establish a new technical committee to define standards for menstrual products. This historic decision comes as the culmination of a global conversation that the RHSC and its Menstrual Health Workstream enriched with the following activities:

### **West Africa champions the VAN**

This month 40 participants convened in Dakar to share lessons learned about VAN and use it more effectively as a tool for advancing contraceptive security across West Africa. Hosted by WAHO with support from key partners (KfW, Ouagadougou Partnership, RHSC, UNFPA, USAID), the meeting assembled delegates from 12 West African countries. The impressive results reported by delegates from Ghana and Nigeria ignited a wave of interest and by the end of the meeting, Senegal, Niger, Cote d'Ivoire, and Togo had formally requested more advanced access to the VAN; others had initiated a series of one-on-one capacity building sessions. West Africa is well on its way to demonstrating the

## Reiterating the case for gloves and forceps

In early 2020, an Innovation Fund-commissioned a [white paper](#) that demonstrated how the lack of equipment and consumables such as gloves and forceps was undermining the achievement of national and global family planning goals. The paper noted that shortfalls arise because adequate funding for consumables is often not systematically factored into financial and supply planning.
