A resulting joint strategy to hold the government accountable on its commitments to allocate \$5.9 million to reproductive health product procurement has paid off. ## Encuentro, ForoLAC Comité Directivo meeting, take place in Panama

Delegations from nine LAC countries came together in Panama for ForoLAC's Encuentro on Business Intelligence for Procurement of Sexual and Reproductive Health supplies. In partnership with UNFPA LACRO, the event saw participants use the SEPREMI business intelligence tool to generate scenarios that will inform procurement plans. Following on from the Encuentro, ForoLAC's Comité Directivo and members gathered in a hybrid meeting which took stock of recent accomplishments and shed light on the regional supplies situation. ## Webinar sheds light on migrant women's reality in Guatemala

The RHSC produced a <u>brief</u> last year on the ongoing migrant crisis in Central America's Northern Triangle, followed by a partnership with Guatemalan NGO Tan UX'IL to provide services in an innovative, "no questions asked" way to migrant girls, adolescents and women traveling

through the province of Petén in their trek to the north. In a webinar this month, Tan UX'IL's Executive Director and longtime activist Ms. Helen Leiva presented the results of the rapid assessment conducted among migrant women and community workers on the Mexico-Guatemala border, helping the RHSC-supported project better understand the need for supplies and services, and to provide emergency kits and mobile services at the border.

### **New Co-Chair for AAWG**

The Advocacy and Accountability Working Group (AAWG) has elected a new Co-Chair Amos Mwale who will take over the role from outgoing Co-Chair Sara Stratton. Mr. Mwale's two-year term will begin following the General Membership Meeting in Accra, where the responsibilities will transition. We extend our sincere gratitude to Ms. Stratton for her hard work and support and extend a warm welcome to Mr. Mwale.
