FP Market Report 2023 shows upward contraceptive market trend 2018-2022

The public-sector contraceptive market in 84 low- and lower-middle income countries grew from US\$247 to US\$257 million between 2018 to

2022, according to the <u>2023 Family Planning Market Report</u> released last week by the Clinton Health Access Initiative and the RHSC. Over the 2018 to 2022 period, long-acting methods including implants and copper and hormonal intrauterine devices comprised the majority share of couple-years of protection shipped, with growth in the share of implants and hormonal IUDs. Landmark development for mifepristone in Argentina

Argentina's national laboratory — Laboratorios Santa Fé LIF — has become the first manufacturer in the LAC region to start producing mifepristone, building on RHSC-supported market assessment work for medical abortion drugs in Argentina, carried out by the Concept Foundation and CEDES Argentina. Next steps will involve obtaining approval from the national regulatory body, ANMAT. Mifepristone is available in 795 public health outlets in Santa Fe.

Participant numbers were about right - it provided the opportunity to actively engage in sessions, and also make contacts in side events / meetings. Often these types of fora are too big to facilitate both.


